AND THIS STONE - Genesis 28:22

Stones are mentioned in the Scriptures for the same reason that a lot of things are: they are part of the landscape.

For every time a stone is just a stone, a stone points to what is anything but ordinary. This is the case in Genesis 28.

It's extraordinary! Really. There is a stone that becomes a pillow and then a monument covered in oil. Jacob is marking the spot where he has an encounter with the holy and did not see it coming. He associates the stone, which he has just set up for a pillar, with the house of God and the gate of heaven. He is nothing if not bold, that Jacob.

Later Samuel will come along and inspire the lyric that many of us sing with gusto, even if we cannot say what it means. "Here I raise my Ebenezer" recalls the moment Samuel took a stone and set it upright to commemorate the Lord's help when it seemed as though the Philistines would be the end of Israel.

Ebenezer means the stone of help.

This Sunday feels like one to stand a stone on end and pour some oil on it. [Do I have to sleep on one the night before?] It sure seems like the Sunday to sing, "here I raise my Ebenezer" like we know full well that we are singing it with all those who have been struck with a sense of God having been our help.

I haven't a clue what is in store for the people called Boulevard (on Broad) but I know that there is biblical precedent for experiencing strange places as (a) awesome and (b) the unexpected source of recommitment to God's holy way.

It is and it isn't about this congregation's October 2018 move from schoolhouse to storefront.

I would like to think that those of present to praise God on Richmond's Broad Street will be those who recall how we -- all of us seeking and keeping the faith - have been called living stones by the Scripture, living stones that have been chiseled from the quarry of the world (Ellen White) and then brought as building materials for something the Lord has designed and is therefore nothing if not good. God go with us. And with you~

Genesis 28:10-22

10 Jacob left Beer-sheba and went toward Haran. 11 He came to a certain place and stayed there for the night, because the sun had set. Taking one of the stones of the place, he put it under his head and lay down in that place. 12 And he dreamed that there was a ladder set up on the earth, the top of it reaching to heaven; and the angels of God were ascending and descending on it. 13 And the Lord stood beside him and said, "I am the Lord, the God of Abraham your father and the God of Isaac; the land on which you lie I will give to you and to your offspring; 14 and your offspring shall be like the dust of the earth, and you shall spread abroad to the west and to the east and to the north and to the south; and all the families of the earth shall be blessed in you and in your offspring. 15 Know that I am with you and will keep you wherever you go, and will bring you back to this land; for I will not leave you until I have done what I have promised you." 16 Then Jacob woke from his sleep and said, "Surely the Lord is in this place—and I did not know it!" 17 And he was afraid, and said, "How awesome is this place! This is none other than the house of God, and this is the gate of heaven."

¹⁸ So Jacob rose early in the morning, and he took the stone that he had put under his head and set it up for a pillar and poured oil on the top of it. ¹⁹ He called that place Bethel; but the name of the city was Luz at the first. ²⁰ Then Jacob made a vow, saying, "If God will be with me, and will keep me in this way that I go, and will give me bread to eat and clothing to wear, ²¹ so that I come again to my father's house in peace, then the Lord shall be my God, ²² and this stone, which I have set up for a pillar, shall be God's house; and of all that you give me I will surely give one-tenth to you."
