#### THAT THEY MAY BRING OFFERINGS - Malachi 3:3

I had the chance to ask her, recently. Why give as you have given, all these years?

Her parents met at Boulevard. But then, so did a lot of people's parents. There had to be more to it. I did my best to articulate my wonder over voicemail. Would you be willing to share with me a little about your support for UMFS?

As far back as I can access, Boulevard has chosen to highlight the work of United Family Services during the weeks leading up to Christmas. Individuals from the congregation have been invited to contribute to a kind of second offering plate.

I figured I had botched the voicemail. When, over lunch, several days later, she looked up at said, "Let me tell you about the Family Services," I couldn't tell if I ought to steady myself for a reprimand or get out my pen and paper.

"It's all trimmings. Rudolph, the snowmen, the decorations.... it's okay to have a little fun with it, as long as it doesn't get in the way, but...."

I recall feeling the glare of cardboard Santa posted up across the café.

"If it's about Christ then it's about what Christ did – what he wanted. The children, for example. He cared for the children. I was not going to have children. I couldn't. I knew that I couldn't from a young age, and so this is my way."

It was "the orphanage" when she was coming along. UMFS adjusted course several times thereafter. As the challenges faced by children and families changed, the response did too. Several minutes passed. She had told me what she knew.

Then this (with fierceness): "Children need families. They do."

I was startled by the statement and by my own realization. Her contribution to our current mission focus had little to do with wanting the children to get presents. It had everything to do with UMFS providing the sorts of services that it does.

What exactly Malachi had in mind when he spoke of a time when righteous offerings would once again be brought to Lord: I cannot say. God gifts us with glimpses, though, and blessed are those who reveal to me the substance of things hoped for~
